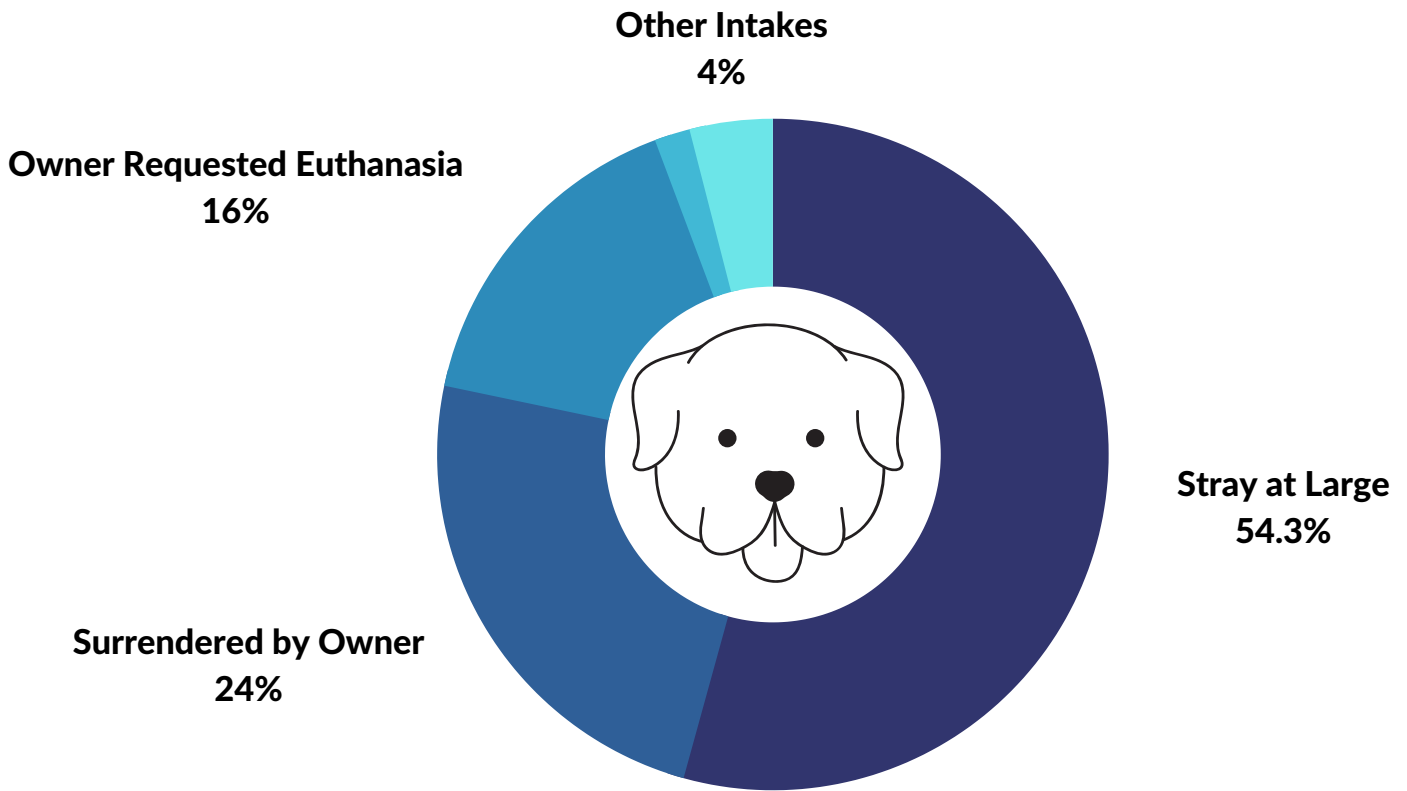

Other intakes typically account for animals in protective custody or our animals being transferred from other shelters.

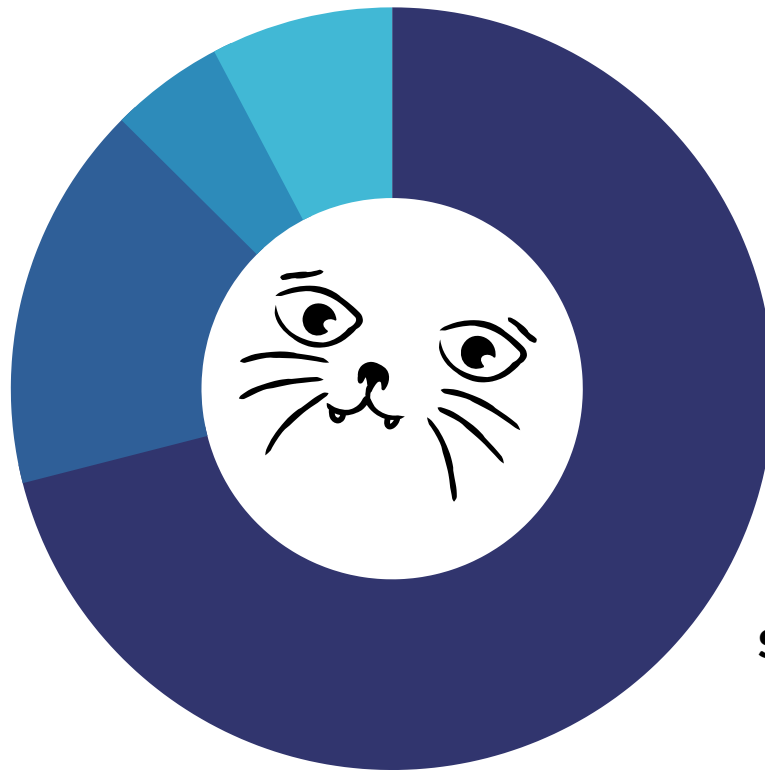

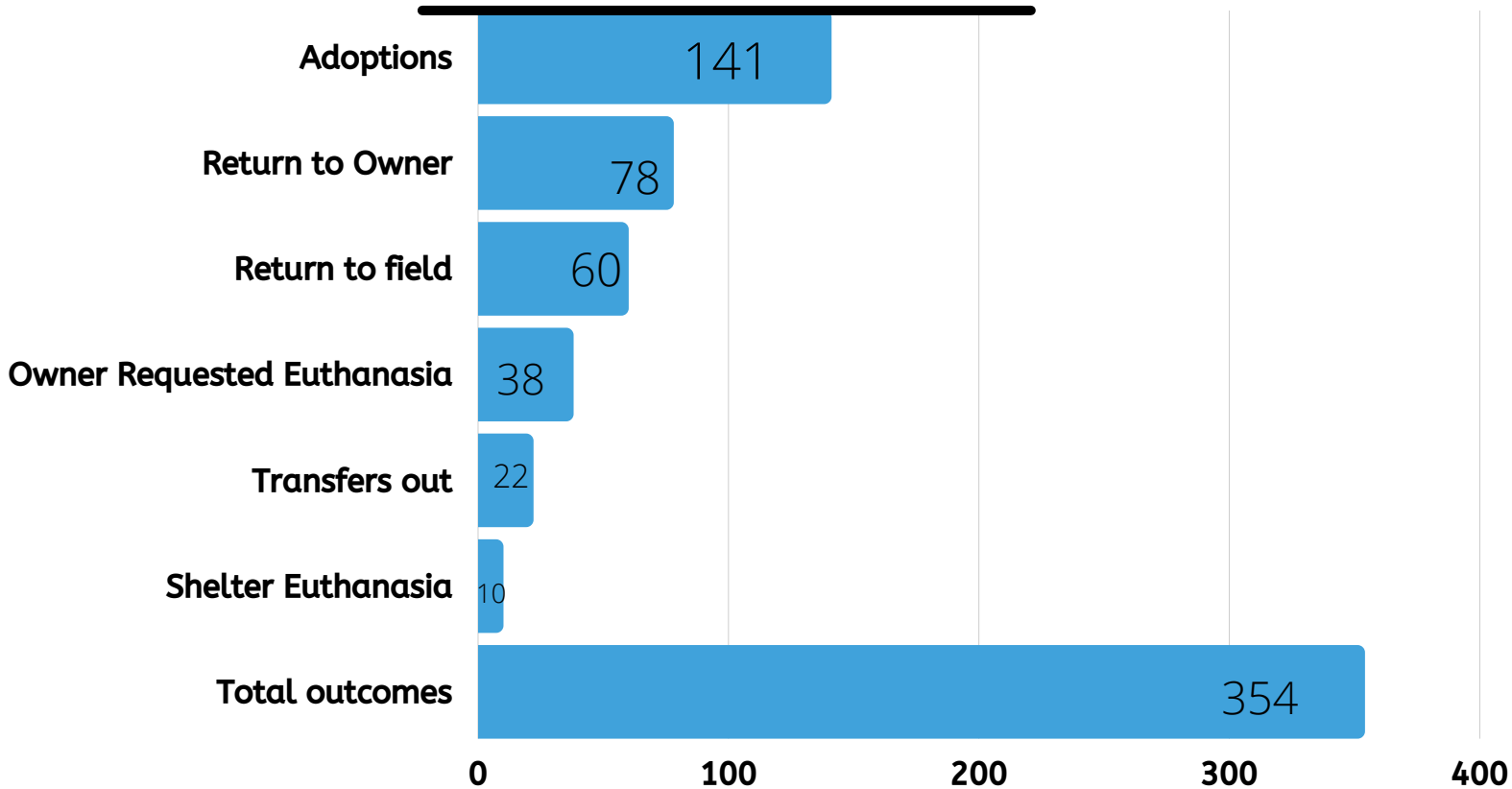

### Outcome Summary

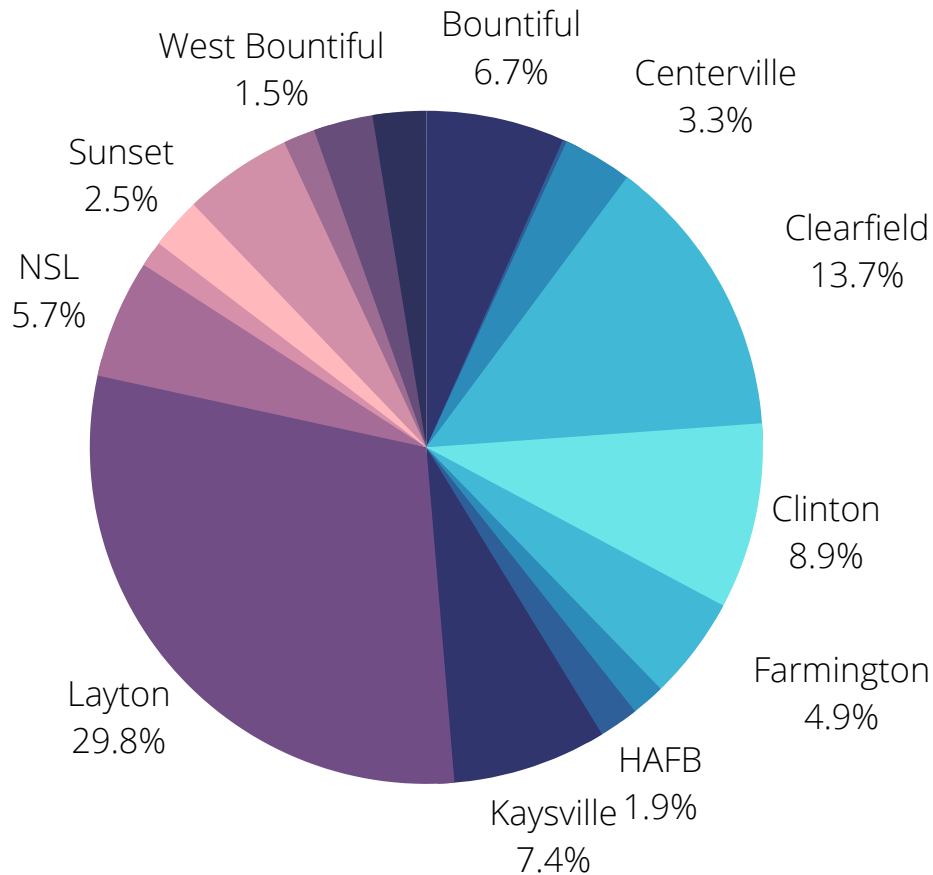
- ACDC cared for a total of 306 animals in the month of February.
- 141 pets were adopted via onsite appointments or at offsite adoption events.
- 78 animals were returned to their owners.
- 60 pets were returned to their owner in the field by an Animal Control Officer.
- 10 animals were humanely euthanized.
- 122 of our animals were cared for by Fosters.

## Field Service



### Field Summary

- ACDC Officers responded to a total of 1054 calls.
- 485 calls were investigations such as potential cruelty or neglect, aggressive animals, license violations and animal bites.
- 213 calls were responding to loose or stray animals.
- 319 calls were nuisance complaints such as excessive barking, excessive feces, fence aggression, leash law and license enforcement.
