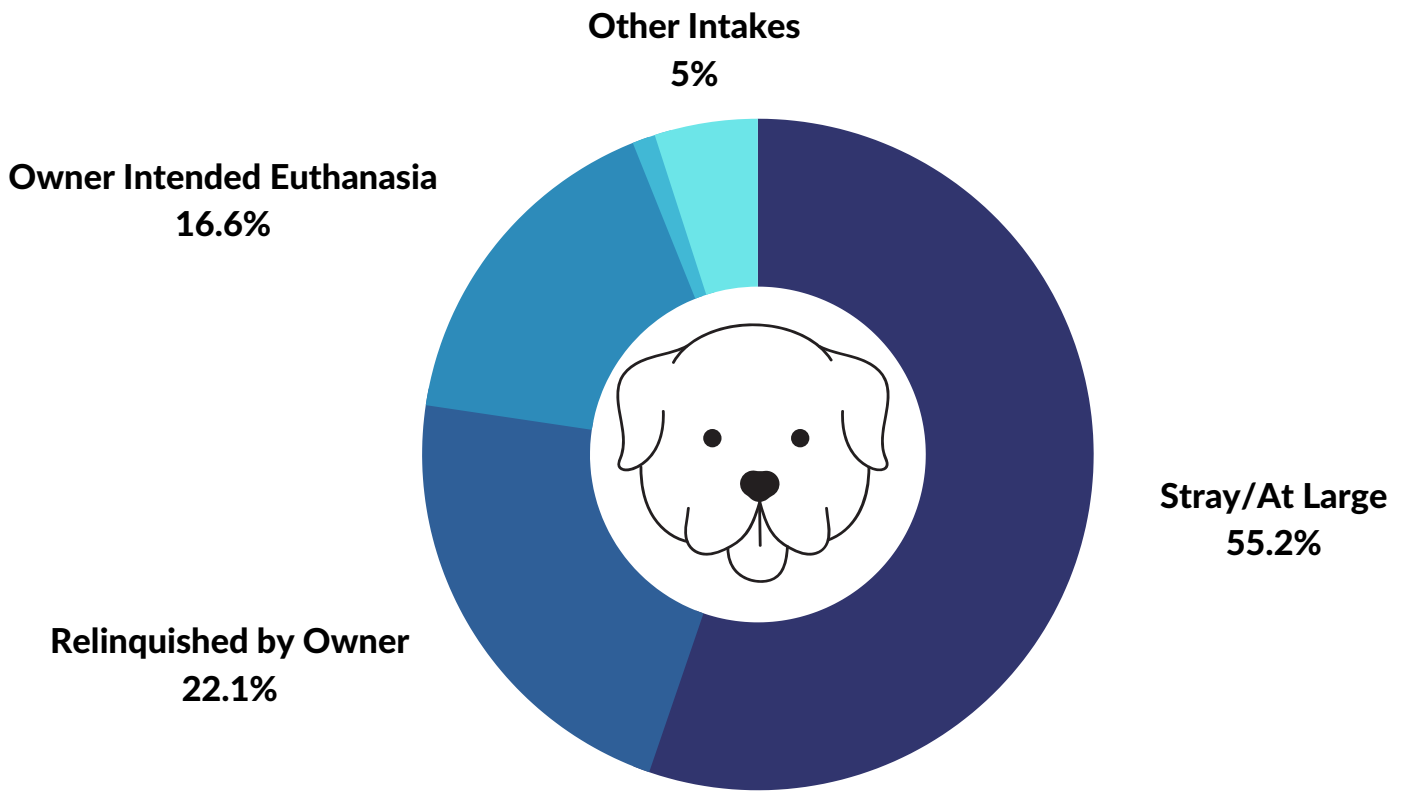

Other intakes typically account for animals in protective custody or our animals being transferred from other shelters.

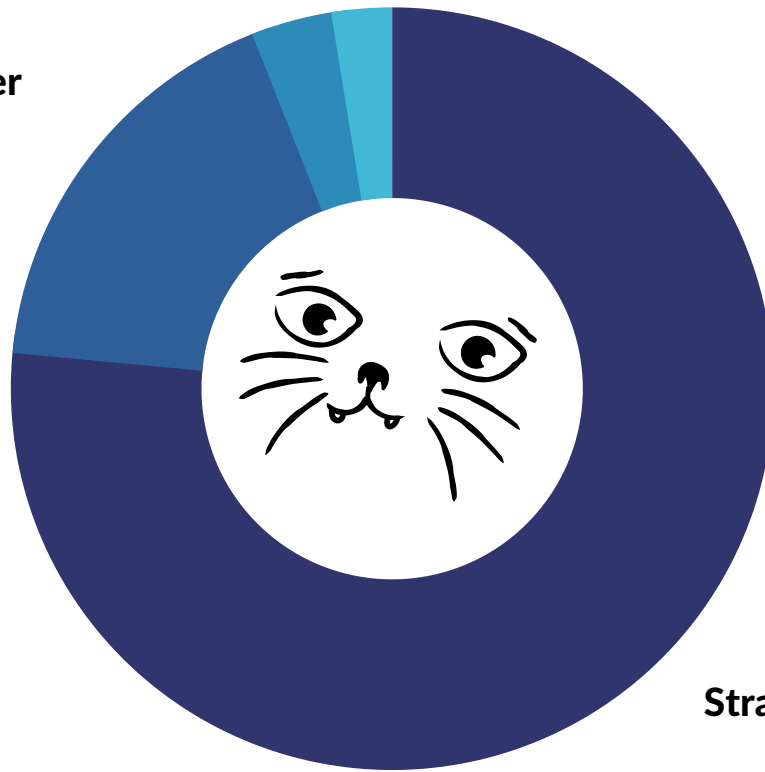

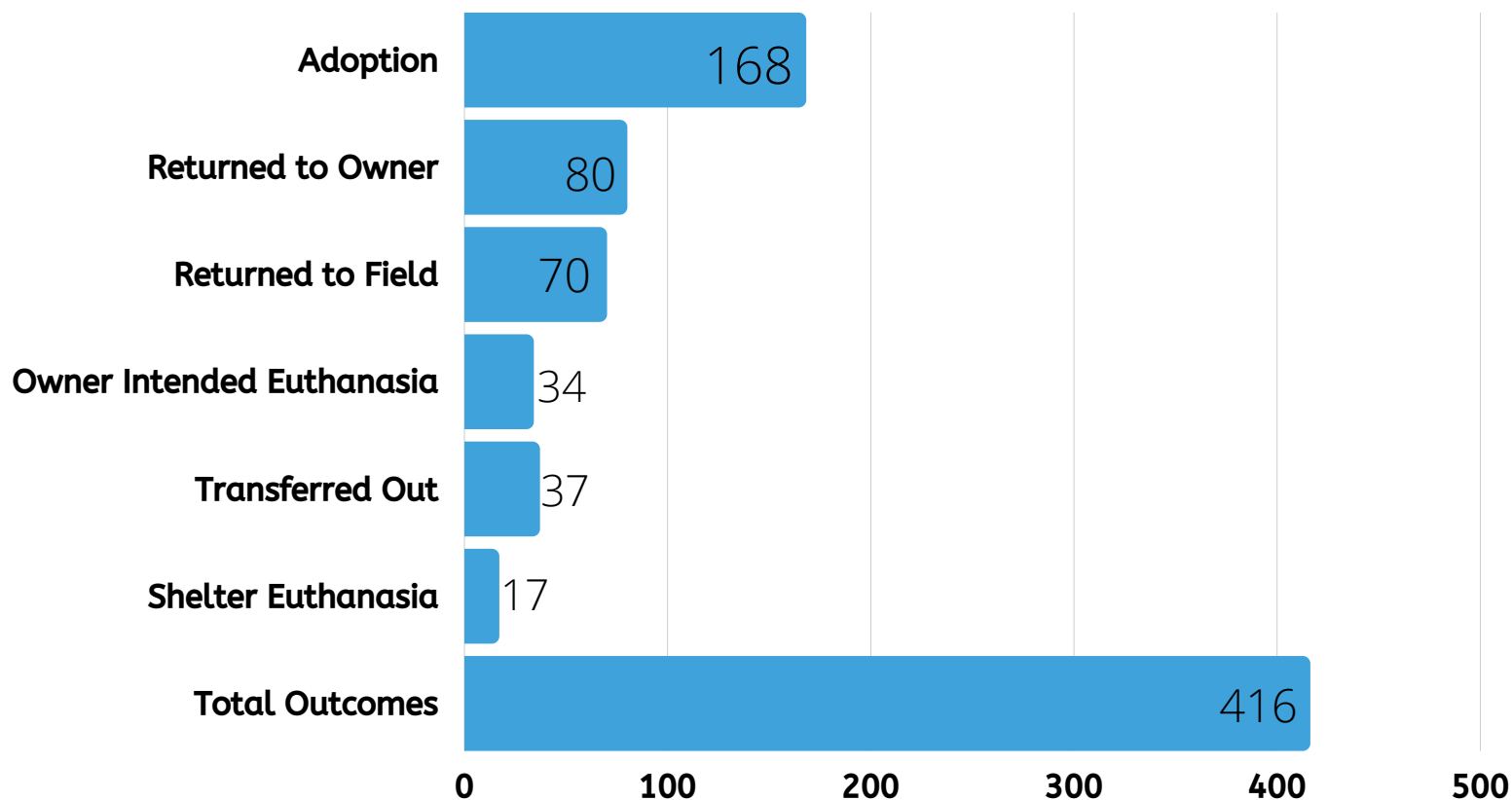

Outcome Summary

- Animal Care of Davis County cared for a total of 415 animals this month.
- 168 pets were adopted via on-site appointments as well as off-site adoption events.
- 80 pets were returned to their owners.
- 70 animals were returned in the field by an Animal Control Officer.
- 51 animals were humanely euthanized.
- 116 of our animals were cared for by our wonderful Foster Families. (Please inquire!)

Field Summary

- Animal Control Officers responded to a total of 1,173 calls.
- 489 calls were investigations such as potential cruelty or neglect, aggressive animals, license violations, and animal bites.
- 238 calls were responding to stray and at-large animals.
- 303 calls were nuisance complaints such as excessive barking, excessive feces, fence aggression, leash law violation, and license enforcement.
