

Respiratory Illness Report - Week ending May 18, 2024


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Overview

COVID-19 Wastewater Surveillance: As of May 16, overall statewide viral concentrations in wastewater have had a small increase, but still remain low. There are two sites (5.7%) in the Elevated category, nine sites (25.7%) in the Watch category, and 24 sites (68.6%) in the Low category. In Davis County, the North Davis site (Layton/Clearfield/Syracuse/West Point area) and the South Davis-North site (Woods Cross/Bountiful/West Bountiful/Centerville area) both increased to the Watch category. Influenza-Like Illness


Graph 1 displays the weekly percentage of outpatient visits due to influenza-like illness (ILI). For comparison, the dashed line shows the previous 5-year average (2018-2022) of ILI activity. This week's ILI rate was 1.4%.

School Absenteeism

Graph 2 displays the weekly percentage of elementary school absenteeism in Davis School District. For comparison, the dashed line shows the absenteeism rate of the previous 5 school years (school years beginning 2018-2022). This week's absenteeism rate was 5.2%.

Emergency Department Visits

Graph 3 displays the rolling 7 day average of the percent of emergency department (ED) visits due to COVID-19, influenza, and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV). These data are obtained from syndromic surveillance and only consider the diagnosis discharge codes for each condition. Table 1 presents two data points for each virus: the current trend of ED visits (increasing, decreasing, or no change), and the percent of ED visits due to each during the currently reported week.





Table 1: Recent Trends of ED Visits, Davis County, Utah, for Week Ending May 18, 2024

Virus	Trend	Percent of ED Visits
COVID-19	Plateau/no trend (last 14 days)	0.3~%
Influenza	Decreasing (last 7 days)	0 %
RSV	Increasing (last 14 days)	0 %
